Actively supervising children in care means being inside the home when children in care are inside the home, being outside when children in care younger than 5 years old are outside, knowing the number of children in care at all times, and focusing on the children and not on personal interests. 30-11(2) (a)-(b)	The provider, not other individuals in the home or outdoor area, must <u>supervise sleeping infants</u> by: having the infants sleep in a location where they are within sight and hearing of the provider or an in-person observation of the sleeping infants at least once every 15 minutes. 30-11(3)	When a <u>wading pool</u> is used by children in care, the provider, not other individuals in the home or outdoor area, must be at the pool supervising the children in care whenever there is water in the pool.			H

Symptomatic individuals cannot enter the home. - Everyone entering the home must wash their hands with soap and running water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer before touching anything. - The provider must only take the children in care to places where social distance and proper cleaning practices can be controlled. - If there is a confirmed case of COVID-19 at the home, the provider must discontinue care and consult with the local health department for the next steps to be taken and when care can be resumed. - At least daily, the provider must clean and sanitizes surfaces, items, and areas that are used and touched often.
